

# Provide Free nPEP for Sexual Assault Survivors

## How Do I Get Free nPEP for My Patient?

The program is easy and free through Altruix. Completely fill out the nPEP/HIV Prophylaxis Treatment Reimbursement <u>Claim & Prescription Form</u>. The form is used in conjunction with the <u>SAFE Guidance Document</u>, which provides guidance on prescribing nPEP.

# What are the Guidelines for the Program?

The Maryland Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services: Sexual Assault Reimbursement Unit (SARU) provides <u>Guidelines</u> which must be followed while filling out the <u>Claim & Prescription Form</u>. Only patients who are survivors of sexual assault are eligible. While all patients must be evaluated for HIV exposure risk per clinical guidelines, a full sexual assault forensic exam (SAFE) does not need to be provided to the patient in order for them to be eligible for free nPEP.



#### **More Information**

#### What is nPEP?

nPEP, or non-occupational post-exposure prophylaxis, is the use of antiretroviral medication to prevent HIV infection in HIV-negative patients who have had a recent exposure to HIV.

Such an exposure typically occurs through unprotected sexual contact or needle sharing\* with someone who has or might have HIV. Non-occupational nPEP is a term used in relation to nonwork related exposure.

#### nPEP is for Emergency Situations

- nPEP is given after a possible exposure to HIV.
- nPEP is not a substitute for regular use of other HIV prevention.

nPEP is not recommended for patients who have an ongoing risk of exposure to HIV. In these cases, alternate prophylaxis regimens including PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis), may be indicated.

# nPEP Must Be Started Within 72 Hours of Possible Exposure to HIV

The CDC recommends that nPEP be started within 72 hours of exposure. Duration for prophylaxis treatment after exposure is 28 days.
